



## Part I

### Inconsistent Responding (INC)

The Inconsistent Responding (INC) score is based on an evaluation of the informant's responses to KAS-R items with similar content. This INC score of 42*T* suggests that the informant gave consistent ratings of the patient's behaviors.

### General Psychopathology (GEN)

The General Psychopathology score (GEN) is a measure of behavioral disturbance. This informant's GEN score of 52*T* indicates an average level of behavioral adjustment.

### Stability (STA)

The Stability (STA) score reflects positive social adjustment. Unlike the other KAS-R scales, high STA scores indicate good adjustment, and low scores indicate poor adjustment. This score of 33*T* is below average. In spite of the relatively poor adjustment indicated by this score, the social resources reported by this informant for the patient included:

### Social Aggression Index (SAGG)

The Social Aggression Index (SAGG) score reflects the presence of problems with anger or impulse control. The informant's SAGG score of 66*T* suggests that anger or impulse control may be a problem for this patient. If the patient is not experiencing an active psychosis, treatment planning should include helping him to develop and practice effective strategies to cope with these difficulties and the situations in which they arise. The ratings that contribute to this high SAGG score include:

This informant's SAGG item cluster scores are 71*T* for Belligerence (BEL), 66*T* for Negativism (NEG) and 53*T* for Verbal Expansiveness (VER). Although the VER score is within normal limits, the BEL and NEG scores are high. Training in effective anger control strategies should be considered for this patient that includes practice acknowledging and taking responsibility for his anger so that he can be more effective in achieving his goals.

**Emotionality Index (EMO)**

The Emotionality Index (EMO) score is a measure of mood-related problems in social adjustment. This EMO score of 49T indicates that the informant does not perceive the patient as having an unusually high level of mood disturbance.

**Anxiety Index (ANXI).** The Anxiety Index (ANXI) indicates whether nervous or anxious behaviors that interfere with social adjustment may be present. This ANXI score of 48T is not elevated and does not suggest that the patient has an unusual level of difficulty in these areas.

The ANXI item cluster scores for this informant are 56T for Anxiousness (AXS) and 41T for Nervousness (NRV). These scores are both within normal limits.

**Depression Index (DEPRI).** The Depression Index (DEPRI) measures the presence of depressive or helpless behaviors that may interfere with social adjustment. This informant obtained a DEPRI score of 51T, which does not indicate that an unusual level of depressive or helpless behaviors are exhibited by the patient.

The Depression (DEP) item cluster score for this informant is 49T, and the Helplessness (HEL) item cluster score is 56T. Both of these scores are within normal limits.

**Disorientation/Withdrawal Index (D/W)**

The Disorientation/Withdrawal Index (D/W) indicates whether behaviors that are associated with an inability to establish communication and maintain social discourse are present. The informant's D/W score of 42T does not suggest that the patient has an unusual level of difficulty in this general area.

The D/W item cluster scores are 46T for Confusion (CON), 45T for Expressive Deficit (EXP), and 42T for Withdrawal/Retardation (WDR). All of these scores are within normal limits.

**Severe Psychopathology Index (SEVERE)**

The Severe Psychopathology Index (SEVERE) provides a measure of the presence of behaviors that are associated with severe psychological disturbance. This SEVERE score of 47T indicates that the patient does not display an unusual level of these behaviors.

**Critical Item Responses:**

4. Has periods where he or she can't stop moving or doing something. 2 - Sometimes

The SEVERE item cluster scores are 45T for Bizarreness (BIZ), 53T for Hyperactivity (HYP), and 45T for Suspiciousness (SUS). All of these scores are within normal limits.

**Part II**

The Level of Performance of Socially Expected Activities (P-Role) score provides a measure of the patient's social performance and contribution to his household or community care group. Unlike the other KAS-R scales, high P-Role scores indicate good adjustment, and low scores indicate poor adjustment. This P-Role score of 57T indicates that the informant has described the patient as contributing as much to his household as do most people.

The Level of Expectations for Performance of Socially Expected Activities (E-Role) score provides a measure of how much the informant expects the patient to socialize actively and contribute to his household or community care group. This E-Role score of 55T indicates that the informant's expectations for the patient's household contributions are at about the same level as the expectations that

most people have for those close to them.

The Expectation/Performance Discrepancy is a measure of how closely the patient's contribution to his household matches what is expected of him by the informant, adjusted for the informant's level of expectations. This EP-Discrepancy score of 48*T* is average and indicates that the patient is doing just about as much as the informant expects of him.

The informant's responses are summarized in the following list. Those areas where the patient's performance falls short of the informant's expectation are indicated with the letter "Y" for "yes".

### Part III

The Level of Performance of Leisure Activities (P-Leisure) score indicates the patient's level of leisure activity. This P-Leisure score of 55*T* indicates that the informant has reported that the patient is using his leisure time about as actively as do most people.

The Level of Satisfaction With Leisure Activities (S-Leisure) score is a measure of the informant's level of satisfaction with how the patient spends his leisure time. This S-Leisure score of 47*T* indicates that the informant is, for the most part, satisfied with the patient's level of leisure time activity.

The informant's responses are summarized in the following list.
